- Elections
 - o According to the statutes of DIG-UM yearly elections must take place, where the following holds: „The representatives of the major resource providers (DESY, GSI, KIT, AIP) and the group of TIER2 centers in turn provide the chairperson for 1 year, which results in a 5-year cycle. A deputy chair is appointed by the members of the RB who will take over as a chair in the subsequent period.”
 - o In detail this means: Achim Streit steps down as chair. The current chair Günter Duceck automatically becomes the new chair and a new deputy chair must be elected. In order to enter the 5-year-cycle the new deputy must come from AIP, DESY or GSI.
 - o Candidates are: Thorsten Kollegger, (Harry Enke not available as he retires towards end of 2023), (Volker Gülzow is very close to retirement)
 - o Eligible voters are: Günther Duceck (LMU), Achim Streit (KIT), Volker Gülzow (DESY), Harry Enke (AIP), - (RWTH), - (Freiburg), Arnulf Quadt (Göttingen), - (MPI-M), Christian Zeitnitz (Wuppertal), Thorsten Kollegger (GSI)
